
COVID-19 Temporary Bookings Report w/e 14 March 2021



A weekly report presenting additional hours booked by NHS trusts in England due to COVID-19, nationally and by region.

- The four week rolling average increased slightly this week, following a continued increase in the total number of hours booked.
- COVID-19 hours saw a rise this week, accounting for 15.8% of all hours booked.
- The number of hours booked increased by 6.7% week on week, driven by increases in London, the South West and South East.
- There was a sharp increase in the number of COVID-19 hours booked in the East of England, accounting for 58.5% of all hours booked.
- General Medicine and Psychiatry Services had the highest number of non COVID-19 hours.
