



A weekly report presenting additional hours booked by NHS trusts in England due to COVID-19, nationally and by region.


- The overall rolling four-week average increased this week, following an overall increase in the number of hours booked in the last few
 weeks. The rolling four-week average for Covid-19 bookings remained static.
- The Midlands and North West saw an increase in the overall number of hours booked this week, increasing by 47% and 35% respectively.
 The North East & Yorkshire and East of England also saw an increase in the number of hours.
- There was a slight increase in the number of hours booked for Covid-19, accounting for 16.3% of all bookings this week. The number of Covid-19 hours in London more than doubled week on week and accounted for over 9% of all hours. In the Midlands, Covid-19 hours accounted for 24% of all hours booked.
- · General Medicine, Chemical Pathology and Psychiatry Services had the highest number of Covid bookings this week.
